## **PowerPlus Glossary**

- <u>Breakout Group Time</u> This is a time of "real life" application of material discussed during the Power Group. Students and Sponsors will meet in their church groups at their assigned location. This is NOT free time or just another recreation time. Breakout material is provided by PowerPlus.
- <u>Breakout Groups</u> This is your church group meeting together to discuss and work through provided Breakout activities.
- <u>Check-In</u> Upon arrival, the group leader must check in at the designated check-in location. Your
  list of campers will be compared to camp records and all needed changes will be made. You will
  pay your final balance and receive lodging assignments, individual nametags, and other program
  items. Please instruct ALL students to remain outside the building.
- <u>Church Group Time</u> Each church will be assigned a meeting place according to their group size, as much as possible. They will be informed of this location during Check-In, and locations will be posted at the entrances to the Tabernacle. Each morning, prior to meeting in Power Groups (Day 2) or in the Tabernacle (Days 3 4), and each evening following the worship service, everyone is to go directly to his or her assigned location. Each morning the Sponsors and Students will meet to be directed in their Quiet Time. After Worship each evening, the Church Group will meet to debrief from the worship service; this is not a time to "reproach" the message, but a time for processing. Most decisions made at PowerPlus are made during this time.
- <u>Free Time/Recreation</u> Students and Sponsors will have the opportunity to participate in Tournament Recreation each morning. The pool, the lake, the pedal cars, and the high elements of the Ropes Challenge Course will also be available during this time.
- <u>Master Teaching Time</u> In-depth Bible Study during the large grade-level Power Groups lead by the Shepherd.
- <u>Missions Track</u> It is a Power Group available to 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students focused on learning about missions while incorporating the camp theme material. Missions Track students will attend the Missions Track Power Group instead of their grade-level Power Group and will participate in a mission project at the camp on day four as part of their missions training.
- Out Group PowerPlus Camp offers a unique Power Group for seniors graduating in the months
  just prior to camp. Graduates are heading out of the student ministry and into the next chapter of
  their lives. Some will head off to college, some into vocational careers. The objective for this
  Power Group is to prepare them for the new chapter in their lives, to provide them the transitional
  camp experience that will better equip them for the future. Out Group students will be led by
  College/University Student Ministry directors and will follow the same schedule and structure as
  the rest of the camp.
- <u>Power Groups</u> Power Groups are divided by grade. Students will attend the group according to
  the grade that they will be going into in the fall. Each Power Group will be assigned a location to
  meet. Power Group time is designed for in-depth Bible Study in a large group. The large group is
  then broken down into small groups for discussion and application of study. A Shepherd, Team
  Leader Coordinator (TLC), and Team Leaders will staff each Power Group.

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- **Quiet Time** This is a designated time for Students and Sponsors to spend alone with God. Quiet Time guides will be provided in the Student and Sponsor books.
- Recreation Blow Out Recreation Blow Out is a time of recreation that will occur after the Worship
  Celebration on Day 1. Everyone must be at the recreation fields during this time. Restroom
  facilities are located in this area so there will be no need to go back to dorms. Neither Students
  nor Sponsors will be allowed in dorms at this time. Dorm areas will be patrolled by PowerPlus
  staff.
- **Shepherd** Master Bible teacher in the Power Group.
- <u>Small Group/Family Group</u> Students will be broken into these groups during the Power Group times. These groups are for discussion and application of the material presented during the Master Teaching time of Power Groups.
- Sponsor Orientation All Sponsors will meet in Hyde Hall. This is a mandatory meeting for all Sponsors. Camp rules and expectations for the week will be addressed, as well as training in Family Groups and other areas of leadership. Team Leaders (small group leaders) will be assigned during this time.
- <u>Student Orientation</u> All Students will meet in the Tabernacle. This is a mandatory meeting for all Students. Camp rules and expectations for the week will be addressed, and Students will receive their Power Group location. Additionally, there will be a special event during this time. At the conclusion of orientation, Students will be dismissed for supper.
- <u>Team Leader</u> The Team Leader is a small group leader within the Power Group structure. Each adult Sponsor will have an opportunity to serve as a small group leader. Team Leaders that serve in the Out Group will need to possess specific skills as presented during Sponsor Orientation.
- <u>Team Leader Coordinator (TLC)</u> The TLC works within the Power Group to coordinate between the Shepherd and Team leaders.
- <u>Tournament Recreation</u> Church groups and individuals have the opportunity to sign up for recreation tournaments on the first day of camp. Brackets will be posted in the dining hall area by breakfast on Day 2.
- <u>Worship</u> Worship is a time of music and preaching by the Camp Pastor. An offering to fund missions will be taken each session.
- Worship Celebration Worship Celebration takes place the first evening of camp. This is a brief time of Worship to "kick-off" the week. EVERYONE must attend.

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
